










Student Wellness and Success Funding Usage	Initiatives
 Mental Health Services	Providing mental health services, including telehealth services, community based behavioral health services and recovery support along with parent outreach.
 Physical Health Care Services	Hiring school nurses and healthcare providers to serve students during the school day. Constructing or adapting existing space for a school-based health center.
 Homeless Youth Services	Providing access to essentials like clothing, hygiene products and transportation to and from medical appointments. Systems improvements and infrastructure to identify, track and support students experiencing homelessness including collaboration with local agencies or organizations to provide support to families who have housing issues.
 Family and Engagement Activities	Hiring a parent ambassador or parent mentor to provide additional support to families. Hosting parent education nights to create opportunities for families and communities to engage in learning skills, content, and curriculum being taught to students in the school.
 Before and After School Programming 	Hiring tutors for after school learning sessions.
 Culturally Appropriate Prevention Services	Purchasing and implementing an approved, evidence-based program to provide students with instruction in suicide prevention.
 Child welfare involved youth services	Providing outreach materials to assist students in foster care with understanding which school-based staff and resources (such as tutoring, afterschool, mental health and others) are available to them.
